Our services are all live in the church and are also broadcast over the internet. If you wish to view the service live then go to the church website at: www.ekopc.org.uk

Track and trace is no longer in operation so all may attend church without booking in advance. Distancing measures have been removed from most of the pews of the church with the exception of those in the west transept where people may sit if they wish to keep a safe distance. Face coverings and hand sanitising will be very much up to each member's preference.

Recordings of each service should become available at some point fairly soon after the service has taken place.

A couple of Sundays ago, I quoted from a report to last month's General Assembly. It stated that in the average Church of Scotland congregation there are 176 members, and 40 are present in worship on a Sunday. The congregation will have had no professions of faith, no weddings, and no baptisms for several years. They will have a Kirk Session of 16 elders, and they will have 4 children associated with the congregation. I find this a staggering statistic, as that means that half the congregations have fewer numbers than this average.

Last November, I was asked to be one of a committee of nine, tasked with devising a plan to reduce the number of buildings and congregations by 40%. I cannot stress enough, that the Church of Scotland is currently in crisis. For years we have put off making difficult decisions about closing buildings and merging congregations, but that is simply not an option anymore.

While that sounds like doom and gloom, I have absolute confidence that God is not finished with the Church of Scotland. He has not left the building. The plan is being called a "mission plan" and the focus is on enabling churches to become more missional. I have heard stories of congregations where there is no one to put out the bins, it is the minister's job, and another situation where the minister came out of the vestry after seeing someone after the service who was upset, only to discover that everyone had gone home and she was left to count the offering, tidy up and lock up. These are not missional congregations.

Every day I give thanks for our folks. It's a standing joke that I don't have keys for the church, but that's because someone else takes on that role. We are almost unique in having willing volunteers to carry out lots of roles which enable me to do the work of ministry, and to give time for mission planning as well. God has plans for the future of East Kilbride Old Parish Church, so please keep mission planning in your prayers over the summer months.

I think that for most of us, in the initial stages of the pandemic, as the restrictions meant that nearly all the activities and social events in the church ceased, we began to wonder if and when things might get back to "normal". Then, as the pandemic stretched out to months and then years, we started to

think that maybe we would emerge to a "new normal".

The recent Kirk Session meeting reflected on some of the changes we made during the pandemic and whether some of them might be continued for a longer period. Members will all know that once services resumed we were still very constrained by mandatory requirements for social distancing, face coverings and hygiene so we adapted our arrangements for Communion services to cope with these requirements. We devised a simpler arrangement with the Minister alone at the Communion table and the individual elements being set out in advance at individual seats for the congregation thus avoiding passing bread and wine hand-to-hand along the pews.

The Session reflected that these arrangements had worked quite well and that there was no theological barrier to continuing to serve Communion in this way. The Session also considered that some members may still feel uncomfortable if we immediately resumed the passing of elements hand-tohand. The Session has therefore decided to retain this simpler style of Communion service, and this will be the arrangement for our June Communion and subsequent services.

Session has also agreed that since the easing of mandatory hygiene requirements from morning service in late March there had been no noticeable problems or issues with the congregation now permitted to use personal judgement on the matters of face coverings and social distancing. The area set aside in the west transept for members wishing to maintain social distancing, and the marking of these pews, will however be retained in the meantime.

Looking further ahead, the Session was updated on proposals for a programme of events planned to celebrate the 250th anniversary of our sanctuary in just over a year and a half. The aim will be to involve all of the church organisations and invitations to participate have now been sent out every one of our groups.

Alistair Walker-Session Clerk d's Wo Christian Aid Week

Once again, East Kilbride Old Parish Church has responded splendidly to the appeals of Christian Aid Week. We've had three main areas of fundraising, and all of them have been very worthwhile.

First of all, our regular CHRISTIAN AID COFFEE MORNING. This was held in the Glebe Street Hall on Thursday 19th May. It was a lovely morning, and

there were all kinds of stalls – jewellery, home baking, books, plants, bric-abrac, and the wonderful smell of freshly-baked pancakes filled the hall. There was a good attendance of people and **a great total - £500 .50**. (The equivalent figure in May 2019, the last time we had a Christian Aid Coffee Morning, was £218). Well done, all the Stall holders and donors, and a very special thankyou to Evelyn Brownlie and her amazing team of helpers.

Next, the new "MY MARATHON" GROUPS. Since the advent of Covid, as we know, it has not been possible to do our normal "House-to-House" Collection, so last year, we tried a new project – doing a sponsored walk with donations being made online, through a "Just Giving" page. That proved successful, so this year, FIVE groups took part in a personal challenge called "My Marathon". The walkers were Alistair and Val Walker, David and Lyn Kent, Andrew Brown and Family, lain Shaw and Friends, and members of the Church Choir – Christine Tweedie, Isobel Glasgow, Fiona Anderson, Gillian Morris and Mary Smith. Together they've covered a huge distance and raised the superb total of £2,055. And there's also Gift Aid to be added to that. So, very well done, everyone.

Then there are all the **DONATIONS**, made either through the Christian Aid Envelopes handed in at the Church, or sent directly to Des Laverty, our Congregational Treasurer, or given through the Christian Aid Boxes which people hand in regularly throughout the year. These donations have come to the excellent total of £1,780. This figure includes £62.50 which Des has claimed through Gift Aid. An additional figure of £112.50 will be claimed by Christian Aid from the Gift Aid slips from our Envelope donations. And the "My Marathon" Groups will have gathered a substantial amount of Gift Aid which Just Giving will process and pass on to Christian Aid directly.

All of these elements together give us a global figure of £4,448.15. That is a wonderful result and warmest thanks to everyone involved, including Diana Ramsey who decorated the Lounge Window with a Christian Aid Week display. Christian Aid is one avenue through which our Christian Faith is demonstrated and it's good that we can show the love of Jesus in straightforward actions of personal help.

The rain didn't dampen our enthusiasm as we listened to him talk about the different bat species, he showed us bat poo and amazed us all with his knowledge of bats! Three Guides, Amelia, Grace & Heidi made their Promise. We also celebrated the achievements of Ellie & Emily who were presented with their Guide Bronze award. Huge congratulations to them all.

A visit to Glen Esk Park gave us the opportunity to create some environmental art as part of Girlguiding Scotland's "Out and About" challenge. One patrol tied their design into the Take 2 in 2022 Scottish Chief Commissioner's team challenge (which we are currently working on) and the other themed their artwork on Girlguiding.




